Louise was a graduate of Kansas State University, Manhattan, KS. She received her Masters Degree from Adams State College, Alamosa, CO in 1972. She taught history and



specialized in teaching remedial reading. She was editor of Dragoo Family Newsletter which has members throughout the United States. She was a member of Mensa International where she edited the newsletter in 1980. She was active in the Tyler County Museum. In 2003 she received the History Hero Award from the WV Legislature.
